### Dangerous Driving needs to Stop NOW

There's long been an issue with drivers speeding in the village. Many reminders have been posted online and in previous newsletters, asking drivers to take more care. It seems these have been to no avail.



In the last six weeks, a number of near misses have left individuals badly shaken and livestock dead. Some of these have been reported to or are being

dealt with by the police, so this is serious! While there have been no injuries to individuals as yet, if nothing changes there will be an accident. And it's the driver who'll be at fault.

The consequences for all can be life-changing not only for the injured person but for the driver too — they could face a 'dangerous driving' charge or worse, It's the driver's responsibility to take due care and attention.

Our lanes are shared spaces, they're not just for drivers. Drivers have no right to make pedestrians move off the road (and should wait until they safely pass). It's the driver's responsibility to keep their speed down where they can comfortably stop to give way to pedestrians.

The Leigh's official speed limit is 30mph. This is the maximum speed, not the speed you should be travelling at; 20mph is a much more reasonable speed with drivers having more time to react to situations. Driving speed should be lower on bends, approaching junctions or when encountering pedestrians, mobile scooter users, bikes and horses — which always have the right of way when there are no pavements.

It's not just delivery drivers that are at fault. The main offenders from recent incidents involved people who live or work in The Leigh. We need to start with each and every resident taking full responsibility and being aware of their speed and their impact on others.

If you have visitors, family, holiday guests or contractors working for you, it's your responsibility to ensure they're made aware of the shared space lanes. Please tell them to keep their speed down, give way and respect our villagers right to be safe.

With more young children now living (or visiting) in The Leigh, they should be able to go out on bikes and walk in safety, without the fear of encountering an erratic, selfish driver.

It's also the responsibility of land owners to ensure hedges are cut back off the road and on bends so that visibility is maximised. There are no restrictions on cutting back hedges at any time of year if it is for the benefit of road safety.

The Parish Council will be looking at ways of ensuring our lanes are made safer and will be deciding on the practical interventions that can and will be taken over the coming months. If you would like to be involved in that discussion then please attend the next meeting, details of which will be posted on the Parish website.
